Rev. Claudia's Letter

May is usually a month for spring cleaning, gardening, and all things pastels, bunny rabbits, and Mother's

Day themed. This year that hits different given the relentless attacks on everything from the environment to the rule of law to women across the gender spectrum.

How do we cope in times like these? It is no wonder that people are turning back to religion for solace. The idea that there is something bigger than Washington, bigger than human-caused crises and panic, bigger than Wall Street mayhem and bigger than my individual problem is an idea that can get us through these things. We call this idea hope, and it comes in so many shapes and sizes. For some of us, hope looks like a found family, a place where we who had terrible mother experiences can come and see healthy families and celebrate good mothering with them. For others, hope looks like a Divine Grace that is bigger than we can name but it is something that we feel deep inside, in the quiet moments like stones sliding into water, like a hug from a friend at coffee hour, like singing a favorite hymn. For yet others of us hope is in the action we take, going to Drag Queen Bingo and reveling in playful art that defies gender binaries. It is found in the marches and protests, in the eco-friendly cups we buy and the plans we have for a future home.

For all of us, it is easy to feel like we are so alone in fighting the tide of terror unleashed by this administration, but the truth is there are far more of us than there are of them. Surveys say that about .3% of the population resonate with UU [source: uua.org]. That means there are 2,100 people in the Metro East alone that are UU and just don't know it yet. Our job is to get the word out about who we are and what we stand for, so those folks find us and come meet their hope right here, inside these walls. That is how we can combat the uncertainty our church is facing, by making our found family, and our voice for justice, ever bigger. Together we grow, together we are stronger, together we overcome. Together, we have hope.

FROM THE PROPERTY SEARCH COMMITTEE

At our April vote, the congregation voted to pursue a property on Center Grove Road in Edwardsville. This vote allowed the committee to do our due diligence on the property. We have bad news.

Based on an evaluation of the septic tank, the current one is insufficient and will not enable us to obtain an occupancy permit. Furthermore, it is impossible to install a tank that does meet code for our population, and the city engineers say the property cannot be hooked into the City sewer. The city is also not favorable toward the parking situation.
